

Florida Future Problem Solving Program State Conference Rules and Regulations

Each participant must sign a behavior contract. Please make copies as needed.

The Florida Future Problem Solving Program's State Conference (FLFPSP) offers unique opportunities and experiences such as educational benefits, opportunity to develop new friendships, and the challenges of independence. The FL FPSP State Conference promotes an atmosphere where chaperones and students support one another with genuine respect. It is the responsibility of each participant to make this experience a positive and enjoyable one for all by exhibiting high standards of conduct and consideration of others at all times. This includes those in your group as well as anyone else you may come in contact with, such as bus drivers, FLFPSP personnel, and hotel staff.

Our goal at FLFPSP is to make this trip an educational, safe and enjoyable experience for everyone. We ask each individual's cooperation and commitment to the following behavior guidelines in meeting this goal:

The FLFPSP Student participant agrees to the following rules of behavior:

- The student agrees to comply with all the rules and regulations of the various governmental and commercial agencies (such as hotel, bus companies, and schools).
- The student agrees to follow the directions, rules, and regulations established by FLFPSP and the school chaperones prior to, during the State Conference, and in returning home.
- The student will respect and follow the directions of the coach, chaperones, FLFPSP staff, and hotel staff and personnel.
- Alcohol, smoking, tobacco products, and illegal drugs are prohibited; use of any of these is cause for dismissal. Inappropriate language will not be tolerated.
- Vandalism, theft or any other type of behavior that is judged to be detrimental to the health, well-being, safety or reputation of an individual or anyone else in the group, including the chaperones, FLFPSP staff or the hotel staff will not be tolerated, and may disqualify an individual and/or team from competition at the discretion of the FLFPSP Board of Trustees or Director.
- Students will remain with their groups. Chaperones should not permit students to roam alone on the hotel grounds. Chaperones should always accompany students.
- The use of hotel rooms carries with it the responsibility of leaving them in the same condition in which they were found. The student is responsible for any property damages. Furniture may not be moved from one room to another.
- Quiet hours in the hotel will be observed by all.
- Throwing of any object from hotel windows or balconies may disqualify an individual and/or team from the competition.

If a student violates any of these rules, he/she may be sent home at the discretion of the team coach, chaperones, FLFPSP administrators or hotel staff. In such cases, the parent/guardian will be contacted, and the student sent home at the parent's expense.

Additions from the Hotel:

Disturbance to Other Guests: Noisy disturbances, loud or bad language, loud music, door slamming, unruly conduct or anything that might disturb other guests will not be tolerated. Regardless of a group's status, curfew is 10:p.m. for noise on the floors or in any public area of the hotel. This is a zero tolerance policy. Any monetary compensation that the Resort is forced to refund to individual guests because of excessive noise or unruly conduct may be charged back to the group's organization. When and if a complaint is called in to our Front Desk or Security, the chaperones will be contacted and advised of the problem, and are expected to correct the problem.
